




Introduction





>Adequacy in Emergency Preparedness


- Need to remain constantly prepared...




Key Considerations

- A Whole School Approach
 - Overseen by School Leaders
 - > Communicated to school staff and student
- Close Coordination with Strategic Partners
 - Police, Civil Defence & Security Watch Group
- Building Resilience
 - > From Young
 - In School Curriculum

Prevention, Mitigation and Reduction of Risks Response, Recovery and Restoration





Taught as part of Social Studies Curriculum

- Key Concepts: vulnerability, social awareness, keeping your environment safe, transnational terrorism and collective security
- Key values: Vigilance, readiness
- Mandatory DRR activities in schools
 - Annual fire drills (with full school evacuation)
 - Annual School Self Assessment
 Checklist
 - Temperature Taking after June and Dec holidays

Prevention, Mitigation and Reduction of Risks Response, Recovery and Restoration





- Special activities held annually to reinforce the messages in school curriculum
 - E.g. Total Defence Day, Racial
 Harmony Day
 - Activities include school based and SCDF demonstrations
 - Learning Journeys
- Co-curriculum Activity an avenue for DRR
 - E.g. Red Cross, National Civil Defence
 Cadet Corp
 - Merging student's own interest with concepts of emergency preparedness and management

Prevention, Mitigation and Reduction of Risks

Security

Security: Deter and Detect

- Built-in security measures (eg, CCTV, fire alarm system, etc)
- Access control for vehicles and personnel



Building and Traffic

Safety: Awareness, Education, Regulation

- > All building in Singapore conform to regulations
- Increase in Visibility of School Zones for Motorists



<u>Health</u>

Health: Avoidance, Detection & Treatment

- Early Detection & Isolation
- Social Distancing
- Emphasis on Hygiene & Social Responsibility



Security Incident Management

- Reporting and management of security incidents
 E.g. Unauthorised entry, suspicious characters/ parcel in school, disturbance at gate, pupils led out of school by strangers, etc.
- b. Conduct After Action Review for security incidents
