Background

- ASSI Project initiated in 2012 & 2013 through country-level consultations in 9 of 10 ASEAN member states; (PHASE 1) Endorsed by ASEAN Committee for Disaster Management (ACDM) at 21st Meeting of ACDM in Chiang Mai, Thailand in 2013 Supporting AADMER WP 2010-15: "Disaster Safety of Educational Facilities" and "Integrating DRR into curriculum" ASSI project entered into implementation phase in 2014 – 16 (PHASE 2),
- Included in Education Sector's Strategic Work plan 2016-2020

Why Safe Schools in ASEAN region?

- Over the last decade, **150 million people in South-east Asia suffered from frequent** natural disasters;
- 100 million children in ASEAN are at risk in schools located in disaster-prone areas;
- absence of regulatory framework, lack of budgetary allocation and technical skills for safe school assessment;
- 80 % of disaster deaths happen in Asia. Children are disproportionally affected by disasters, but also strong agents for resilience
- 14,500 schools were fully or partially damaged in disasters in SEA over the last 5 years
- Schools are powerful venues for resilience building

What will ASSI achieve?

Accelerating progress among regional stakeholders in Safe Schools (SS) development through positive changes in 4 key areas:

1. Strengthened regional collaboration on SS across ASEAN on development of a common regional SS Framework, guidelines, tools, and shared good practices



2. SS models established in highly disaster-prone districts and communities in eight ASEAN MS to field test and disseminate policies and tools



3. Commitment and long-term supports to SS through enhanced partnerships among ASEAN MSs, key IOs, private sectors, and CSOs

4. DRM in Education sector to be part of Sendai DRR Framework & SDG in support of the Worldwide Initiative on SS and Education for All

- Strategic Work Plan for Education 2016-2020 (development is ongoing)

- Aligning with global interventions (SFDRR & SDGs)





Post AADMER Strategic Priorities: Next Steps

- Joint endorsement of the ASEAN Common Framework for CSS by the Education and DM sectors
- Strengthening of knowledge and good practices exchange mechanism among AMSs
- Strengthening of inter-agency coordination
- Compilation and standardising school safety tools and resources in country
- ASSI engagement of private sectors and other relevant sectors including Youth sector, development & planning sector, budget and finance sector and media
- Strengthening ASEAN capacity on SS and development of pool of trained SS experts/practitioners
- Strengthening resources mobilization with the leadership of the ASEAN Member States
- Providing technical support in the development or enhancement of SS database and information system in AMSs
