

When and Why ART has Existed?




ART was established in 1994 to response to the rapid increasing of the HIV epidemic in the region:

- Prevention of further HIV infections
- Expanding HIV care, treatment, and support
- Reducing HIV stigma and discrimination



What is the current migration situation?*

- * Data are lacking undocumented migrants are difficult to quantify!
- There are approximately 5 million migrants in
- Thailand, mainly originating from:
- •Myanmar: approximately 3.2 million people
- •Cambodia: approximately 1.2 million people
- •Lao PDR: approximately 900,000 people

Migrants are Vulnerable!

- Large populations of undocumented migrants from Cambodia and Laos live & work in Thailand
- They do not have/have limited access health care services, especially psycho-social support (PSS) & anti-retroviral (ARV) therapy




Migrants are therefore vulnerable in need of support and services

a Regional Cross Border Cooperation Project (Thailand-Cambodia-Lao PDR) on improving access to ARV among migrants living in Thailand to:

- 1. To provide pre-departure education to all migrants about HIV/STI, human rights, legal documentation and contact persons.
- 2. To produce leaflets on HIV and contact persons in host and origin country in 4 languages (Cambodian, Lao, Thai and English).
- 3. To ensure the consistency of ARV treatment for PLHIV migrants through referral system, follow up and patient tracking.
- 4. To increase the collaborations with all key partners including UN agency, INGOs, Local NGOs and government to support ARV among migrants.
