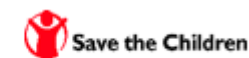

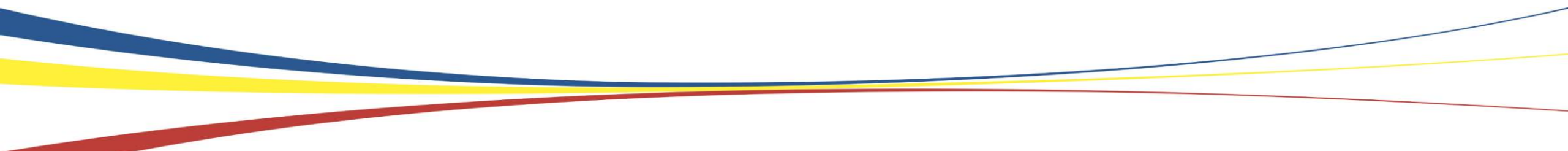
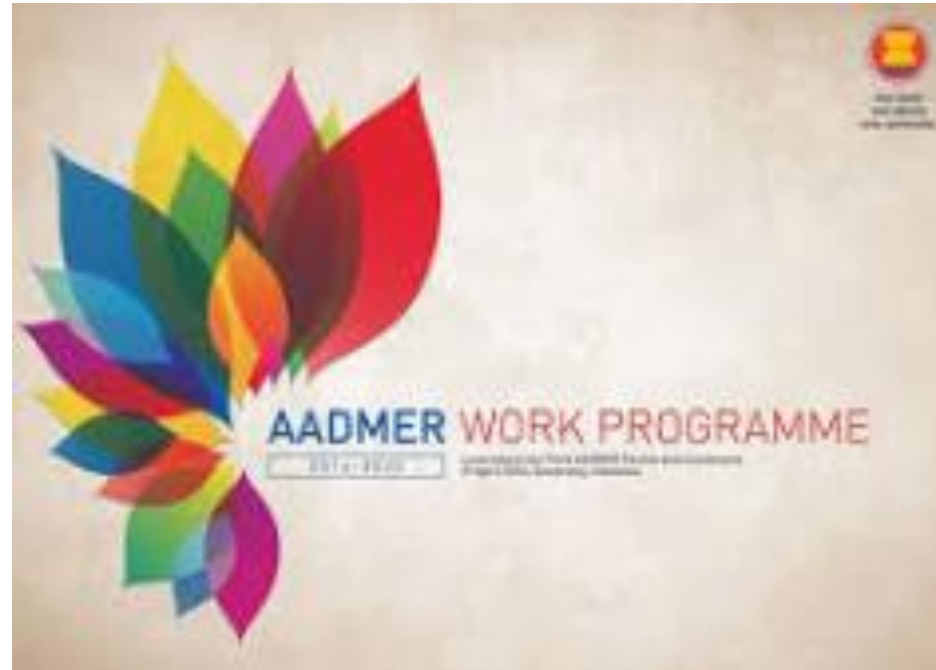

Regional Frameworks for ASSI



Principal objective:

Children in ASEAN are more resilient to disasters and have a safe and secure learning environment

Objective 1:

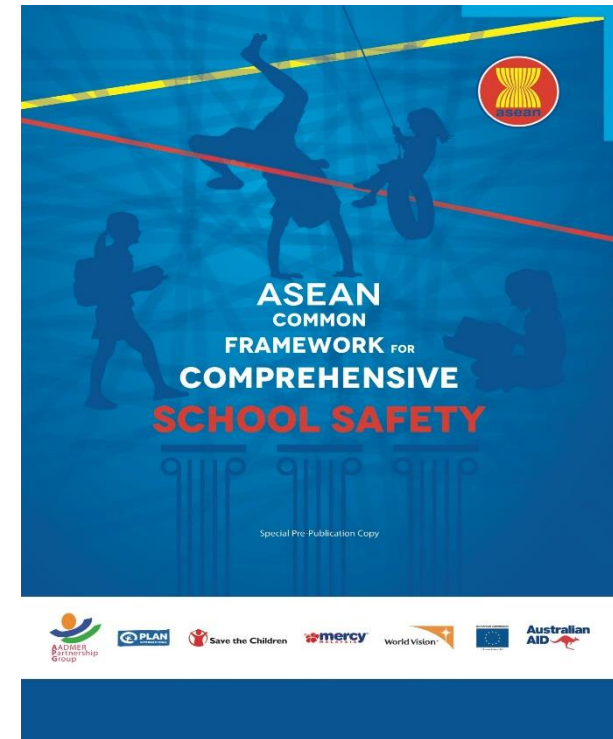
Strengthen advocacy to increase resources and funding, tools, local expertise and guidance for school safety initiatives in the ASEAN region

Objective 2:

Improve capacities at the national level through inter-agency collaboration and the use of a comprehensive school safety framework

The ASEAN Common Framework for CSS

- Elaborates the operationalisation of the CSS Framework into workable plans and programmes for the ASEAN context in concurrence with global efforts for integrating DRR in the education sector
- Strategically guide DRR integration in the education sector through comprehensive interventions, unified actions and synergy at different levels (school, sub-national, national, regional)

Engagement and policy advocacy

- ASSI is a sub-regional initiative to the APCSS in Southeast Asia
- ASSI engages with IFRC through lessons learnt workshop, technical inputs, joint regional event
- ASSI engages with UN agencies (UNESCO, UNICEF, and UNISDR) for promotion of school safety in SEA
- Exchange of resources with other relevant projects in ASEAN



National implementation on school safety

- Establishment of national coordinating mechanism on school safety in **Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, Cambodia**
- Working Group on DRR in **Myanmar** includes school safety as the component for coordination
- Integration of school safety strategies in **Myanmar** Action Plan for Disaster Risk Reduction
- Dissemination of tools/framework/manual across countries in ASEAN
- Self-assessment suit/digital application for school risk assessment tried out and owned by MOES in **Lao PDR**
