Thematic Updates from Southeast Asia

At Regional Level:

ASEAN Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction 2018



The 2018 ASEAN Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (AMCDRR), which took place on 3-6 July in Ulaanbaartar, Mongolia, was participated by over 3,000 participants. The focus of the conference was on reduction and migitation of disaster-related risks and aligning risk reduction activities with the Sustainable Development Goals. At the end of the conference, the <u>Ulaanbaartar Declaration</u> was issued, addressing the needs for turning coherence global frameworks into policy and practice to achieve resilience at national and local levels across all sectors. The <u>Action Plan 2018-2020</u> of the Asia Regional Plan for Implementation of the Sendai Framework was also adopted. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Annual Meeting of National Society Legal Advisers 2018

The Annual National Society Legal Adviser Meeting was held during 2-4 July, hosted by both the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and IFRC. One of the main purposes of the meeting was to enable the legal officers from the National Societies to meet up and discuss on legal issues that are of relevance to the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. Representatives from over 90 National Societies attended this year's meeting. Among the issues discussed were the security of staff and volunteers and protection of personal data within the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. A representative from the Malaysian Red Crescent had the opportunity to present on the importance of having a standard reporting mechanism for Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (click here to view the presentation).

IFRC Launches Emergency Appeal to Support Lao Red Cross's Relief Operation Following Dam Collapse

An <u>Emergency Appeal</u> was launched on 26 July seeking CHF 2.9 million to enable IFRC to support the Lao Red Cross (LRC) to deliver assistance and support 7,500 people for 18 months. The Appeal came following the flash flood that took place on 23 July caused by the collapse of Xe-Pian Xe-Namnoy hydropower dam. According to the 6 August UN <u>Situation Report</u>, the flood water has affected more than 13,000 people and resulted in 34 deaths and 97 missing. More than 6,000 people have evacuated to emergency shelters, some of them have no homes to return to. As of 16 August, CHF 2.1 million worth of soft and hard pledges have been received.

(New!) Highlight Updates from Southeast Asia Gender and Diversity Network

Welcome to the new section of the newsletter! From this month onward, updates will be provided on the work of the 11 Southeast Asian National Societies in mainstreaming the concept of Protection, Gender and Inclusion (PGI) in all their activities and programmes.

The Gender and Diversity (G&D) Network was established in 2015 in light of the <u>Resolution</u> adopted in the same year at the 32nd International Conference of the Red Cross and Red Crescent pertaining to the joint action on prevention and response to Sexual and Gender Based Violence (SGBV) (click <u>here</u> to read the background report on SGBV presented at the International Conference). Members of the G&D Network are focal persons appointed in 2015 by the leaders of each National Societies in Southeast Asia by way of translating the commitment to the Resolution into actions.

The G&D Network members meet yearly to discuss and share experiences and progress related to PGI work in their National Society. In the recent meeting in July 2018, the Network discussed strategies to increase awareness of SGBV in emergencies and identified long term strategies to address structural inequality that leads to SGBV. The Network also discussed the need to have a standard reporting mechanism for sexual and gender-based harassment and abuse that may occur during periods of armed conflict, disasters, and other emergencies.

During 10-12 July, the Gender and Diversity focal persons from nine Southeast Asian National Societies met in Bangkok to: follow up on SGBV prevention and response plan the Network has worked on after its 2017 training; to review changes in the revised Minimum Standard Commitments on Protection, Gender and Inclusion in Emergencies; and to share experiences, update knowledge, discuss issues/problems and identify solutions. A training was also given to the network participants and other external partners on SGBV to review key concepts to equip National Societies with the tools to advocate for the importance of SGBV in emergencies both within their National Societies and externally. Brunei Darussalam

Brunei Darussalam Red Crescent Offers Emergency Aid Training at 'Bandarku Ceria'

On 22 July, Brunei Darussalam Red Crescent Society participated in the Car-Free Sunday activities (locally called *Bandarku Ceria*), which is held every Sunday to the public, and showcased its Emergency Aid operation including stretcher carrying techniques, wound dressing, and injury treatments. Cambodia

Cambodian Red Cross Conducts Disaster Response To Assist Flood-Affected People in Steung Treng

As a result of the dam collapse in Laos' Attapeu Province, over 25,000 people of Steung Treng Province in Cambodia were forced to evacuate from their homes due to flash floods. The Cambodian Red Cross has deployed its disaster response team from Red Cross branch level as well as from the Headquarters to the affected area and begun the disaster response operation since 24 July 2018. The relief distributions included 2,000 relief kits (rice, canned fish, instant noodles and non-food items) and 500 units of plastic tank (plastic sheet). Prior to the dam collapse, Cambodia was already experiencing severe flooding across the country due the heavy rainfall caused by the Son Tinh Typhoon that has hit Mekong region countries in mid-July. Indonesia

Indonesian Red Cross Conducts Relief Operation for Earthquake Victims in Lombok

Indonesian Red Cross (Palang Merah Indoneisa-PMI) provided relief assistance to victims of the 6.4-magnitude earthquake in Lombok that took place on 29 July and whose aftershock continues to be felt into the beginning of August. PMI and other agencies have since provided humanitarian aid in the form of blankets, clothing, food, tarpaulins, mats, beverages, pharmaceuticals, as well as cash transfer and health services. IFRC has launched an Emergency Appeal to raise fund that will be used to support PMI's in delivering assistance and helping an estimated 80,000 people for 18 months. Click here for more information.

Indonesian Red Cross Conducts Logistics Capacity Development Program

In July, Indonesian Red Cross conducted a capacity building program attended by representatives from six National Societies from Denmark, Myanmar, New Zealand, Switzerland, Timor-Leste, and the United States. The goal of this program was to enhance PMI's management knowledge, ability, technical skills, coordination, and communication, especially in the field of logistics during emergency responses. Through the activities under the program, PMI also hoped to strengthen cooperation among the National Societies on logistic supports. Lao PDR

Lao Red Cross Provides Relief Assistance to Flash Flood Victims in Attapeu Province

Following the collapse of the Xe-Pian Xe-Namnoy hydropower dam on 23 July, Lao Red Cross Headquarters and provincial chapters have since provided assistance in search and rescue, as well as distributing tarpaulins to help shield tents and shelters from water. Relief kits including food, clothing, blankets, hygiene supplies, household effects and mosquito repellent have also been distributed. Lao Red Cross teams have been providing health and sanitation training to people of all ages, including training community representatives to pass this knowledge onto others in their village groups. Philippines

Philippine Red Cross Assists People Affected by Tropical Depression Josie

During the third week of July, the Philippines experienced a series of heavy storms as a result of the Tropical Storm Inday and Tropical Depression Josie. The monsoon rains have displaced around 5,000 families or over 20,000 individuals. The Philippine Red Cross provided rescue and relief supported to the affected areas of Metro Manila, Zambales, Pampanga, Tarlac, Batangas, Bataan, and Cavite. With its fleet of rescue vehicles composed of four 6x6 trucks, two mobile kitchens, seven rescue boats, two ambulances, two fire trucks, and two amphibians, PRC has assisted in the evacuation of 290 individuals in Pangasinan and Olongapo. Singapore

Singapore Red Cross Raises Fund, Sends Humanitarian Aids To Help Victims of Lao Dam Collapse

In response to the floods caused by the sudden hydropower dam collapse in Laos' Attapeu Province, Singapore Red Cross (SRC) launched a public fundraising appeal on 25 July and pledged about CHF 36,000 in humanitarian aid to the affected communities. SRC collaborated with Lao Red Cross to mobilise a three-person advance team to deliver relief supplies to some 1,000 families from 26 July to 31 July. Singapore Red Cross Hosts Young Humanitarian Summit

The annual Singapore Humanitarian Youth Summit 2018 was held during 7-8 July, bringing over 100 local and regional participants together to share experiences and best practices, to develop a better understanding of current humanitarian issues. This year's organising team launched a nation-wide humanitarian challenge 'Humanithon', a 36-hour Prototyping and Design competition, to inspire humanitarian actions through multi-disciplinary collaboration and innovation. Youth were motivated to think out of the box to advocate blood donation, care for the disabled, promote social inclusion and address issues such as the burgeoning elderly population and increasing migrant population. Singapore Red Cross Launches Mobile Community Health To strengthen Eldercare

Singapore Red Cross has unveiled Community Health on Wheels (CHoW), a community-based mobile healthcare programme that brings free ancillary services and basic medical care directly to the heartlands. It was the latest of SRC's ongoing efforts to strengthen community resilience and improve the lives of local vulnerable. CHoW was developed with the aim of supporting the health needs of the community, in particular, the elderly population. The mobile unit is equipped with basic medical diagnostic and therapy equipment. CHoW will visit different parts of Singapore on designated weekends to provide health checks, physiotherapy services, psychosocial support and health counselling. Thai Red Cross Society Sends Relief Items, Deploys RDRT Staff To Assist Flood Operation in Lao PDR



To assist the flood operation in Attapeu Province, Lao PDR, the Thai Red Cross Society (TRCS) has delivered support including relief item and tents to the Lao Red Cross to assist with the relief operation. Two members of the Regional Disaster Response Team from TRCS have been deployed to help train volunteers on health and hygiene promotion for the displaced people who are residing in the evacuation centres. Viet Nam

Viet Nam Red Cross Carries Out Relief Operation in Areas Hit by Typhoon Son Tinh

Typhoon Son Tinh made landfall on 19 July, damaging infrastructure and crops in Thanh Hoa and Nghe An Provinces. Heavy rains have continued in the wake of the typhoon, causing floods and landslides across vast areas of the country, including in the capital Hanoi. On 23 July 2018, the Viet Nam Red Cross Society Headquarters decided to launch national appeal to mobilize resources for the continuous relief efforts in the affected provinces. VND 248 million (CHF 10,600) was distributed to support families whose members lost their lives and injured, as well as those whose houses were collapsed.

Viet Nam Red Cross Society Delegates Visit Laos' Attapeu Province To Deliver Relief Assistance



The report is the result of a collaboration between IFRC and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Committee for Disaster Management (ACDM) Prevention and Mitigation Working Group. It contains compelling recommendations for change, which IFRC has already started implementing. The report draws on household surveys and focus group discussions involving 1,800 people affected by disasters in Indonesia, Lao PDR and the Philippines. It shows a rise in risks including sexual harassment, child marriage, child sexual abuse, domestic violence and trafficking in Indonesia, Laos and the Philippines. Click here to download.



For the upcoming July – September season, odds are strongly tipped in favor of below-normal rainfall across much of Indonesia, Central America and the Caribbean. Southern and eastern Australia, Japan and parts of western Canada and Alaska show moderate odds for below-normal rainfall. Areas with some chance of above normal precipitation include South Africa and parts of the western and central Sahel.
