that the Climate Change is not even a decree yet and is losing momentum for approval. Margaret/UNDP explained to us during lunch that government might have to redo the entire consultation process for CC because it was downgraded from "law" to "decree". It *may* still be approved, but it's taking a lot of time compared to the DM Law.

Lastly, there is a need to clarify provisions on IDRL.

Target submission to NA is on the first NA meeting on July 2019. Latest would be in the second meeting on November 2019.

III. Presentation at DM Law Consultation with International Dev't Partners (July 25)

Mr. Prasong chaired the DM Law Consultation with International Development Partners. It was attended by all members of the DM Law Drafting Committee and some representatives of IGOs and INGOs (complete list to be submitted once MLSW shares meeting minutes). Majority of the participants were from Government. The meeting was funded by ADB.

Ms. Thipasong Akhamountry attended on behalf of LRC and actively led her group in the discussions. Ms. Thipasong is an ideal representative as she is from DM and can also speak English fluently.

Attached is the unofficial English translation of the 1^{st} Draft DM Law and the consultation mechanics. The 1^{st} draft is the product of the 2^{nd} technical meeting funded by IFRC.

MLSW will finalize the meeting minutes with ADB. I have requested a copy of this once finalized.

IV. Support to IFRC/LRC Response to Lao Dam Collapse (July 24-27) From July 24-27, I assisted the IFRC and LRC response to the "Laos dam collapse" as (a) media spokesperson and (b) HCT liaison. I was main coordinator from July 24-25, and supporting coordinator from July 26-27 upon the arrival of IFRC Bangkok CCST deployment Warongrong (Ying) Tatrakom.

(a) Media spokesperson

With guidance from the IFRC AP Communications Manager Rosemarie North, I handled interviews from BBC World News, BBC Radio, Al Jazeera, CNN International and New York Times to report on IFRC and LRC's response to the disaster.

(b) HCT liaison

I was able to leverage on IFRC Disaster Law Programme's existing relationship with UNDP Lao PDR to facilitate IFRC participation at the HCT coordination meetings and share relevant info to IFRC BKK and IFRC APRO.

I have endorsed the work on media relations and HCT coordination to Ms. Ying Tatrakom who is now taking the lead on these for IFRC in Lao PDR.

(c) IDRL issues

After having been informed of MoFA's restriction on entry of international personnel, I had the chance to discuss with VP Amb. Thongpachanh regarding possible entry of international Operations Manager from IFRC to support the response. MLSW's advice to Amb. Thongpachanh is to send the person's details, length of stay, etc to MoFA for its approval. Update: IFRC already sent a letter to Amb. regarding this.

However, entry of international personnel and goods is quite difficult since government has centralized the consignment of goods at its military facility in Vientiane, while international humanitarian personnel are not

allowed entry the moment, pending the disaster assessment of Sanamxay district, Attapeu province.
