

| Background                                | As mentioned in the AADMER Work Programme 2016-2020, "a resilient future necessitates the active involvement of the youth" (priority programme 3 - ADVANCE). Furthermore, the AADMER Work Programme includes "advancing ASEAN Community that is safe, resilient to disasters, and adaptive to climate change, with youth and good governance at the centre".   |
|   | Related to ASSI, the priority programme 2 (BUILD SAFELY) includes "Establishing a platform to link NDMOs and relevant government agencies with professional associations of engineers, urban planners, and other similar professions, and youth organizations to promote safe schools" (activity 2.4.2).   |
|   | Finally, the priority programme 8 (LEAD) includes "opening opportunity for youth to contribute for innovations in the area of disaster management" (activity 3.1.2).   |
|   | The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) has been supporting the 10 National RCRC Societies in ASEAN countries in implementing a wide range of activities in schools in partnership with both NDMOs and MoEs. This includes both curricular and extra-curricular activities and is anchored in the RCRC presence within schools and communities through their network of 1 million volunteers and 4 million youth in ASEAN. |
