### Why did we educate mothers?

**NORTHERN SHAN STATE** - "We came to the Muse township in northern Shan state bordering China to do awareness raising sessions with mothers, using information materials from the Ministry of Health and Sports. The mothers learned about proper handwash tips and other preventive measures against COVID-19. Why did we educate mothers? Because in Myanmar culture, mothers spend much more time with children than fathers do. So once you educate mothers, they will educate their children and also their husbands. And this way, we educate more people in the village."

Myanmar Red Cross Society (MRCS), in close coordination with the Ministry of Health and Sports (MoHS) at national, regional and township level, has mobilized a large number of Red Cross volunteers to support the MoHS response to COVID-19 with main focus of awareness raising and information sharing through social media and health education at the community level. Additionally, MRCS has been supporting MoHS in screening people in migration entry & exit points as well as in community-based surveillance measures. MRCS also distributed sanitizers and masks, as well as procured PPE to be well prepared for possible outbreak and its impact to its frontline health volunteers working in communities. MRCS continues to lead the Red Cross & Red Crescent Movement Task Force which convenes once a week to effectively and timely respond to the fast-evolving situation. On 13 Feb 2020, MRCS launched the emergency plan of action (Required Amount: CHF 1,226,730) supported by the Movement partners. On 11 February 2020, IFRC [launched](#) its revised emergency appeal for COVID-19 outbreak response. This Emergency Appeal seeks a revised **total of CHF 32 million** to enable the IFRC to support its membership to deliver assistance and support to communities affected or at risk of being affected by COVID-19. Assistance will be tailored to each country depending on its epidemic preparedness and response, as well as the vulnerability of particular groups of people in the community.
