2nd Southeast Asia RCRC Youth Forum

Phnom Penh, 17th – 20th September 2023

Title: Agenda for 2nd SEA RCRC Youth Forum 2023, in Phnom Penh, Cambodia What: 4 days for Youth Forum for RCRC Youth Delegates + 2 days for SEA RCRC Leaders Meeting Participants:

- 24 Participants from RCRC SEA Countries (1 SEAYN member, 1 youth staff and 1 youth leader from each of the 10 National Society, and 10 from the CRC with gender balance) to support SEA Youth forum;
- To engage youth participation in the Youth Forum, 10 CRC youth are selected and trained as Liaison Officers for youth and leaders delegation;
- In Climate Change action and to promote green environment, Tree Planting Event is organized in the morning of day 4 at The Kirirom National Park (around 100 KM West of Phnom Penh)
- To deepen the understanding of IHL, a visit to the Toul Sleng Genocide Museum is organized in the afternoon of day 4;

Where: Sokha Phnom Penh Hotel and Residence, Cambodia. Date: 17th to 20th September 2023 (4 Days) for the 2nd SEA RCRC Youth Forum; 21st to 22nd September 2023 for the 20th SEA RCRC Leaders Meeting.

Background

Youth is the backbone of a country. They play pivotal roles for sustainable national development, peace, unity, solidarity, and prosperity. Education, hand-on working experiences, continued capacity building, and leadership in their respective positions are key for youths' participation in sustainable and inclusive socio-economic development. Having considered the essential roles of youth, the 2nd SEA RCRC Youth Forum aims to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. To provide opportunities for youths to receive trainings and hand-on experiences in leadership and effective communication including, but not limited to, public speaking, project pitching, negotiation and persuasion, and team management.
- 2. To engage in the discussion in identifying current challenges for the SEA RCRC Movement and the root causes by revisiting 2022 Youth Statement, SWOT, 5why, and problem tree, based on different themes including Education, Health Care, Disasters and Climate Change, First Aid, Road Safety, School Safety, and Humanitarian Innovation.
- 3. To propose possible solutions to the 2023 SEA RCRC challenges.

- 4. To identify and highlight the roles of youths in contributing to the future of Red Cross Red Crescent / Humanitarian Innovation.
- 5. To put knowledge and skills into practices through the development of the joint statement to be presented in the Dialogue Sessions of the 20th SEA RCRC Leaders Meeting and the 2nd SEA RCRC Youth Forum on theme: **Youth contribution for the future of RCRC/ Humanitarian Innovation**;
- 6. To have hand-on experiences in Climate Change action (tree plantation) at the Cambodia Buddhist Cultural Centre located in Kirirom National Park, and a visit to Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum to learn about the atrocity of Khmer Rouge and unfortunate history in Cambodia (April 1975 to 7 January 1979) and the efforts for national reconciliation and rehabilitation, which has brought Cambodia to the current state of peace and development.

Expected Outputs

By the end of this forum, the following outputs are expected:

- 1. 3days training and one day field tree planting/Humanitarian field trip and hand-on experiences are provided to SEA RCRC Youths.
- 2. A list of current challenges for the SEA RCRC Movement are identified based on different themes highlighted in the objectives.
- 3. Solutions and Prototypes to address the 2023 SEA RCRC challenges are proposed;
- 4. Social media contents for each thematic theme to be used for each National Society are created and widely shared;
- 5. Key roles of youths in contributing to the future of Red Cross Red Crescent Movement/ Humanitarian Innovation are identified;
- 2nd SEA RCRC Youth Forum Joint Statement and Commitment (reflect and adapt from Bandar Seri Begawan Youth Forum Statement) with concrete follow up plan for each National Society is developed and to be presented at the 20th SEA RCRC Leaders Meeting;
- 7. Hand-on experiences in Climate Change action and the Cambodia's unfortunate history of the Khmer Rouge genocide are provided to youths (reflection sharing/ presentation from the participants);
- 8. Round Table discussion between Youth Delegates and SEA RCRC Leaders on the topic: "Youth contribution for the future of Red Cross Red Crescent Movement / Humanitarian Innovation" is organized.

Expected Outcomes:

- 1. Capacity of youths in leadership and effective communication including public speaking, project pitching, negotiation and persuasion, and team management is built.
- 2. The pivotal roles of youths are promoted more widely to multi-stakeholders and the public via social media contents.
- 3. Improved youths' engagement in the discussions on their contributions to Red Cross Red Crescent Movement/Humanitarian Innovation through the development of joint statement, identification of challenges and proposed solutions, and their roles.
- 4. Better understanding and more active participation in Climate Change action and environmental protection.
