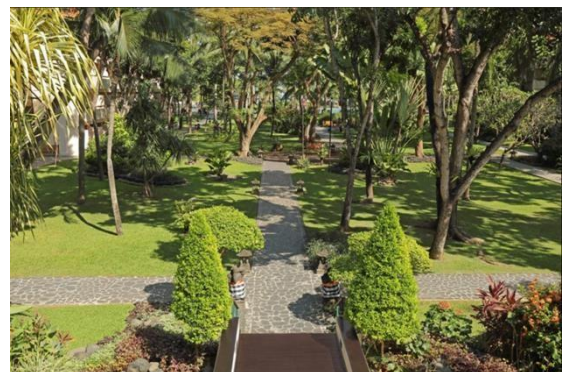

Cost

- **Travel**

Travel costs and flight arrangements to/from Bali, confirmation of flights, airport taxes and fees, travel insurance will not be covered by the host NS.

- **Accommodation**

The host National Society will cover all National Societies accommodation costs (hotel room and meeting facilities) for the approved participants (2 persons first aid representatives from each National Society). The participants will stay in single deluxe bedroom. Coffee breaks and lunches will be provided during the meeting.

The other expenses including additional hotel expenses such as additional guest in the room, laundry, mini bar service, internet, telephone calls, faxes, taxi fares, early or late check in etc. are the responsibility of each delegation to be settled before leaving the hotel.

Participants should note that the check-in time is 14:00 in the afternoon and check-out time is 12:00 at noon.

Transportation

- **Electronic Customs Declaration**

After claiming your luggage, you will be passing through the Customs by filling out the Electronic Customs Declaration shown in QR code format. Kindly visit <https://ecd.beacukai.go.id/> and presented the QR code to the Customs Office.

- **Arrival Day (2nd September 2024)**

After you claim/collect your luggage and pass through airport's customs channels you will enter the arrival hall. Once you exit, kindly look for the volunteers from PMI Bali with the red vest and the signage of PMI and Bintang Bali Resort as shown below.



- **Departure Day (5th September 2024)**

The Hotel will take the delegation at the Bali Bintang Resort no later than 3 (three) hours before your flight. Kindly be ready at the lobby for the airport transportation.

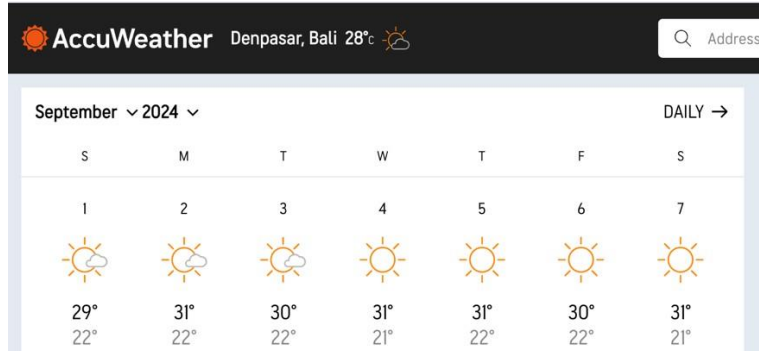
Travelling Requirements to Indonesia

- Citizens of ASEAN member countries, such Brunei Darussalam, the Philippines, Cambodia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, Thailand, and Timor Leste, are eligible for **visa-free entry** to Indonesia with a maximum period of 30 (thirty) days and cannot be extended. The visa will be granted directly at immigration border control if all requirements are met.
- Before entering Indonesia, kindly ensure that your passport has the validity minimum 6 (six) months with the return air flight ticket.

Weather



Bali, as most of the areas in Indonesia, has a tropical monsoon climate, with two seasons: rainy and dry. The average temperatures of between 21 and 31 degrees Celsius where you will feel comfortable all month long. The weather in September is expected to be warm, sunny and almost rain-free. However, we suggest you bring an umbrella. The hotel provides an umbrella inside the room to be used during your stay.

The meeting room will be air-conditioned; participants are advised to bring a light jacket/pullover for the meeting hours.

Electricity



In Indonesia the standard voltage is 230 V. The standard frequency is 50 Hz. The power sockets that are used are of type C / F (with two round holes plug). You can use your electric appliances in Indonesia, if the standard voltage in your country is in between 220V - 240V (as in the UK, Europe, Australia and most of Asia and Africa). Manufacturers take these small deviations into account. If the standard voltage in your country is in the range of 100V - 127V (as in the US, Canada and most South American countries), you need a power (voltage) converter.

To be sure, check the label on the appliance. If it states 'INPUT: 100-240V, 50/60 Hz', it can be used in all countries of the world (like chargers for tablets/laptops, photo cameras, cell phones, toothbrushes)

Language

Indonesia is the official language. English is commonly spoken by people living in big cities, including Bali. The younger generation and those in the tourist industry.

Practical Information

Currency

The local currency is Indonesian Rupiah which is equivalent to IDR 16,200 to a US dollar. Currency can be exchanged at the airport or any bank or at the hotel or exchange bureau. Automated teller machines (ATM) are readily available.
