Better Together Solidarity (BTS) Fund

BACKGROUND

- Southeast Asia as a region is vulnerable to various natural hazards and faces heightened risks compounded by climate shifts
- Critical need to strengthen resilience to disasters and crises
- Funding often poses a significant challenge in enhancing institutional capabilities



Better Together Solidarity (BTS) Fund

OBJECTIVES

- Ensure that SEA National Societies have access to the necessary funding to support their capacity-building efforts.
- Seeks to build stronger National Societies that are prepared for future crises and able to support neighbouring National Societies affected by crises.



WHAT WILL THE FUND COVER?

The fund aims to support <u>training</u>, <u>workshops and learning</u> <u>programmes</u> that focus on enhancing the quality and sustainability of operations for Southeast Asia National Societies. Training, workshops and learning programmes can include areas in the following:



Organisational
Development/National
Society Development



Operational Readiness in Crises



Other Capacitybuilding areas eg. Innovation, Women Leadership



Proposed Funding Mechanism

- SRC as the steward of the BTS Fund
- All SEA NSes as both contributors and recipients of the fund
- Funding cap of SGD 40,000 per training/workshop/learning programme, allocated to cover logistical and operational costs eg. training venue, accommodation, airfare etc.
- Usage of fund to be reported annually to SEA RCRC Leaders
- SRC to work on a concept note for the BTS Fund once endorsed by SEA RCRC Leaders
